Safety at SJB

Please read the following safety tips:

- 1. Ensure you are using the crosswalks appropriately with your children during drop off and pick up times.
- 2. Ensure you are reminding your child to sit responsibility while riding the bus and not eating or drinking during their ride.
- 3. Choose a meeting spot with your child that is not in a high traffic area (ex. Front of the school or bus layby) as these are busy places for our bus students both before and after school.
- 4. Do not park your car in the 'Stop and Go' or the designated Daycare area as this creates backup and delays in traffic.
- 5. Communicate with your child's teacher (either in the agenda or email) or the school office if there is a change in plans in how your child will be getting home. With no information from you, your child will be expected to go home their usual agreed upon way according to school documentation.

learned the importance of patience, communication, and attentiveness, ensuring that
everyone, from fellow students to parents and other community members, can safely cross
the road. Their commitment to safety and their role as leaders in our community is truly
commendable, and they exemplify the values of responsibility and care that we hold dear
in our school. Patrollers will be out assisting families cross in the mornings. Elecia Grange
from AMA came out on September 24, 2024, to train our patrollers. We are continuing to

When driving towards the crosswalk please slow down and watch for our Grade 6 student patrollers, who are out daily. If you need to stop, please allow a safe stopping distance from the crosswalk. When stopping for a pedestrian at a crosswalk, drivers should stop their vehicles far enough back (about two to three car lengths) so traffic in other lanes will be able to see the pedestrian and have time to stop.

When walking across the crosswalk please wait for the patrollers to say "proceed." This is the signal that patrollers are trained to use when it is safe to cross. If cars have not stopped, patrollers will not say "proceed." Students have been instructed to look for a safe gap in traffic. If there are any concerns, please do not address the patrollers, see staff that are outside supervising. Staff members will address. Patrollers are working diligently to ensure a safe crossing for all and continue to work on their skills year-round!

HOMEREADING PROGRAM BEGINS OCTOBER 7th

One of our school goals continues to be building literacy in our students, as it will serve them well into their future. With our continued efforts towards building literacy in our students, we would like to share with you some information about our school-wide Home Reading Program. You and your child are invited to be a part of this reading incentive program that will complement their current home reading. Essentially, the program provides an opportunity to make reading a special time for you and your child. We will be kicking off our **Home Reading Program on October 7, 2024**, which also marks the start of Read-In Week, an annual event towards the promotion of Literacy development.

How the Home Reading Program works:

- Each student will have access to "home reading books" that they can read at home.
- Each student will receive "Incentive Sheet" with strips on it. After your child has read, and met their specific minutes/goal each night, a parent or guardian is asked to initial one box on the incentive sheet. Only one box can be initialed each night, regardless of the amount of time spent reading.
- As your child completes one full reading strip, they are to hand the strip in to their homeroom teacher, whereby the teacher will tear off the strip and submit their name into a jar.
- At the end of each month, during morning broadcast there will be one name drawn from each classroom jar. If your child's name is drawn you will have a free pizza lunch with Mrs. Schultz.
