


Fun Day

Indigenous Day

On Friday, June 21, 2024 it is National Indigenous Peoples Day. Across the country of Canada there are many activities taking place to celebrate this day. It was first celebrated in 1996 to reflect and celebrate the unique traditions and heritage of the Indigenous, Métis and Inuit peoples who were the first to live in Canada.

It is celebrated on June 21st to represent the significance of the longest day of the year. One big thing that happens in Canada is the sunrise ceremony in Toronto. At the sunrise ceremony, people share prayers and thanks for all creation and Mino Bimaadiziwin which is Ojibwe for The Good Life. In Niagara Falls, the colours of the Medicine Wheel are lit too. A way we can participate in the Indigenous Day activities is to do bright arts and crafts to represent the art done by the Indigenous peoples.

Indigenous Day is an opportunity for Canadians to think about, and acknowledge the diverse heritage culture and achievements of the three peoples that were first in Canada. The Indigenous people that lived in the plains, celebrated the Sun Dance, the Coast Salish peoples took part in the Winter ceremonies, and the Haudenosaunee people participated in the Green Corn Ceremony. The Inuit peoples of Canada took part in hunting and practising survival techniques. The Métis people told stories, played music, danced and made different types of artwork.

In conclusion we should all take some time on the longest day of the year to research, learn and think about the Indigenous, Métis and Inuit peoples who have been here for centuries. We also should all wear orange or red on June 21 to celebrate National Indigenous Day.

TRY IT OUT!

Cream Cheese Mints Recipe

Have you ever heard of chewable mints? Would you want to make them? Let me tell you a secret, you can make them at home using a few simple ingredients. These creamy mints are great for any occasion, Christmas, Easter or even just when you are bored at home.

Ingredients

- 3 oz cream cheese
- 3 cups powdered sugar
- 1 tbsp softened butter
- 2 tsp peppermint extract
- Few drops of food colouring (optional)

Instructions

- 1. In a large bowl, weigh the cream cheese, and then mix and smash it with a fork until creamy and soft.
- 2. Add the butter to the bowl, and mix well with the cream cheese.
- 3.Add the peppermint extract to the butter and cream cheese mixture, mix until combined. This is also a great time to add your food colouring.
- 4. Gradually add the powdered sugar mixing with a spatula.
- 5. When all of the ingredients are combined into a dough, shape the dough into small balls and flatten with a fork.
- 6. Let it stay on the counter or in the fridge on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper for 2 hours.
- 7. Enjoy!
