#### **Indigenous Veterans Day- November 7**

Indigenous Veterans Day is observed in Canada on November 8, as we do not have school that day, we will observe it on November 7th. This day is in recognition of Indigenous contributions to military service, particularly in the First World War, Second World War and the Korean War. Many Indigenous people also currently continue to serve in the Canadian Armed Forces in Canada and on operations around the world. They continue to uphold the proud legacy of service of past generations. Wearing a beaded poppy is about respect: lest we forget, the service and sacrifices of Indigenous and non-Indigenous soldiers, their shared values and their shared history. The beaded poppy is a source of pride and resilience. It is also an opportunity to have conversations about reconciliation. While beaded poppies honour all veterans, they draw attention to the unique plight of Indigenous people who went to war.

In addition to recognizing Louis Riel Day on November 16, the Métis Nation of Alberta (MNA) has declared the week surrounding November 16 as "Métis Week." The week is devoted to commemorating the sacrifices of the Métis who continue to strive toward rights and recognition as a distinct nation.

At St. John Bosco School, we encourage and continue to invite students to share their Godgiven gifts in service towards others and reflect on how they are sharing their gifts and the message of HOPE. We teach, encourage and recognize positive attitude, good character, and responsible citizenship.

In our daily conversations, actions and reflection we focus on Catholic virtues which are highlighted in the school agendas at the beginning of each month. Students exit the building via their designated door. Please ensure if there is a change in routine that you write a note in the child's agenda book, so the staff know how to adjust bus schedules and pick ups. The school playground is not available for students after school without your supervision.

#### **Traffic Safety Information**

Safety is everyone's responsibility:

- 1. Use the parent drop off zone west of the layby in front of the school for quick "drop and go".
- Be mindful and respectful to our school patrollers and staff who are out there doing their best to keep everyone safe.
- 3. Keep crosswalk areas clear.
- 4. Use designated crosswalks.
- 6. Staff parking lot is limited for staff use only.



#### **Inclement Weather Procedures**

The cold weather is coming, and staff and students have noticed. It is time to plan for and start wearing those warmer jackets, hats, mittens and boots. Staff and students continue to go outside for recess and sometimes physical education classes unless it is too cold. Edmonton Catholic Schools follows the Government of Canada Weather Forecast site for weather updates. Staff and students do not go outside if the temperature is -20° C or colder, or if the temperature and wind chill factor are -20° C or colder.
