## Transportation Services Messaging

### Waiting for the school bus:

- 1. Students are required to wait outside at the bus stop 5 minutes before the scheduled time.
- 2. Students are only expected to wait 10 minutes after the scheduled time before going back inside to tell a parent the bus has not arrived.
- 3. If a bus has not arrived, parents must call Transportation Services at 780-441-6078.
- 4. Parents should have a plan B in place in case the bus is significantly delayed.

**Outstanding Transportation Fees:** Please be advised that parents with outstanding bus service fees will receive a <u>weekly</u> email reminder for payment. Cancellation request forms received after the 15<sup>th</sup> will incur full monthly service fees for that month. Please cancel the bus service immediately to avoid unnecessary charges.

### What to do when your yellow school bus is running late?

One of the most common questions from families is "What do I do when my yellow school bus is running late?". The website ecsd.net/busdelays has recently been updated to clarify

our recommendations for families in the event of bus delays. Feel free to use the following text in any upcoming newsletters:

We want all families prepared in the event of bus delays. While bus drivers will complete their route, no matter how late they may be running, we recommend that families make alternate arrangements if a bus does not arrive within **20 minutes** of its scheduled time.

To help prepare for a delayed bus, families are reminded to:

- Check for delays before you head out the door via the BusPlanner Delays App or the ECSD bus delays website.
- We recommend children wait with a friend or trusted adult at the bus stop.
- Have a plan in case the bus does not arrive. For example, return home or go to a neighbour's house.
- Make alternate arrangements for getting their child to school if needed.
- Dress children appropriately for the weather to withstand any delays or wait times.

### Stay Notified

Our Transportation Services team uses several methods to keep families informed about bus delays:

- BusPlanner Delays App: Download the free app on Android or iPhone to receive notifications
- Division Website: Delayed routes are posted at <a href="https://ecsd.mybusplanner.ca/Alerts">https://ecsd.mybusplanner.ca/Alerts</a>.
- Call Transportation Services at 780-441-6078.

### Pre-Enrollment Information

The purpose of pre-enrollment is to give families the opportunity to let us know what your registration plan is for September 2025. Kindergarten students are considered new students and will be considered in the same way all new registrations are processed. All new registrations are created through the online registration system.

Parents will be asked to declare if they will continue to attend St. John Bosco School or if they are not returning, such as in the case of choice-based programs and junior high transition students in grade 6.

After parents declare their intention, you will be asked to submit it electronically for approval. Returning students will be approved and no additional steps are required of the parent.

- 1. Using the parent drop off zone west of the layby in front of the school for <u>quick</u> "drop off and go" (no parking for any duration of time as it backs up the flow of heavy traffic).
- 2. Giving priority to emergency vehicles, buses, daycare vans.






## Offered to both our English and French Immersion students!

The Accelerated Math and Science program is a math and science focus program for students in Grades 7-9 that offers students the opportunity to specialize their focus in mathematics and/or science and is specially designed for those who have a love for learning, enjoy being challenged, and love solving problems in unique or creative ways!

It is designed for students who enjoy a challenge and are capable of learning at a faster pace than that of the regular classroom. It provides students with the opportunity to complete Math 10C and Science 10 by the end of Grade 9. Course requirements are rigorous and students are commonly required to spend more time working outside of class to be successful. Here is what students can expect throughout the program:



- Math/Science 7
   Math/Science 8 (Apporoximately 50% of Grade 8 outcomes)

   Math/Science 8 (Remaining 50% of Grade 8 outcomes)
   Math/Science 9 (Apporximately 75% of Grade 9 outcomes)

  - Math/Science 9 (Remaining 25% of Grade 9 outcomes)

Math 10C / Science 10

Admission to the program is based on the following criteria to ensure that École St. Cecilia's Accelerated Math and Science Program is a right fit for your child.:

- · Achieve a standard of excellence on the entrance exams.
- Students will have demonstrated an overall standard of excellence in Math and/or Science in Grade 6.
- The student's past report cards will indicate not only academic ability but also strong organization and work habits.
- Require recommendation from their Grade 6 teacher providing information about:
  - Academic achievement / ability
  - · Work habits / Organizational skills
  - Motivation / Effort
  - Ability to work independently

Only 33 students will be admitted to this program, in both the English program and the French Immersion program. Registration links will be available on the <a href="Open House page">Open House page of our webpage</a>.
